KU early learning comes to Queanbeyan

The first sod has officially been turned on the new KU Queanbeyan South Early Learning Centre due to open in early 2011, which will provide education based long day care for children aged 6 weeks to 6 years.

The new centre which will be operated by not-for-profit organisation, KU Children's Services, will be located on Alanbar St Karabar making it close neighbours with Queanbeyan South Primary School and Karabar High School.
